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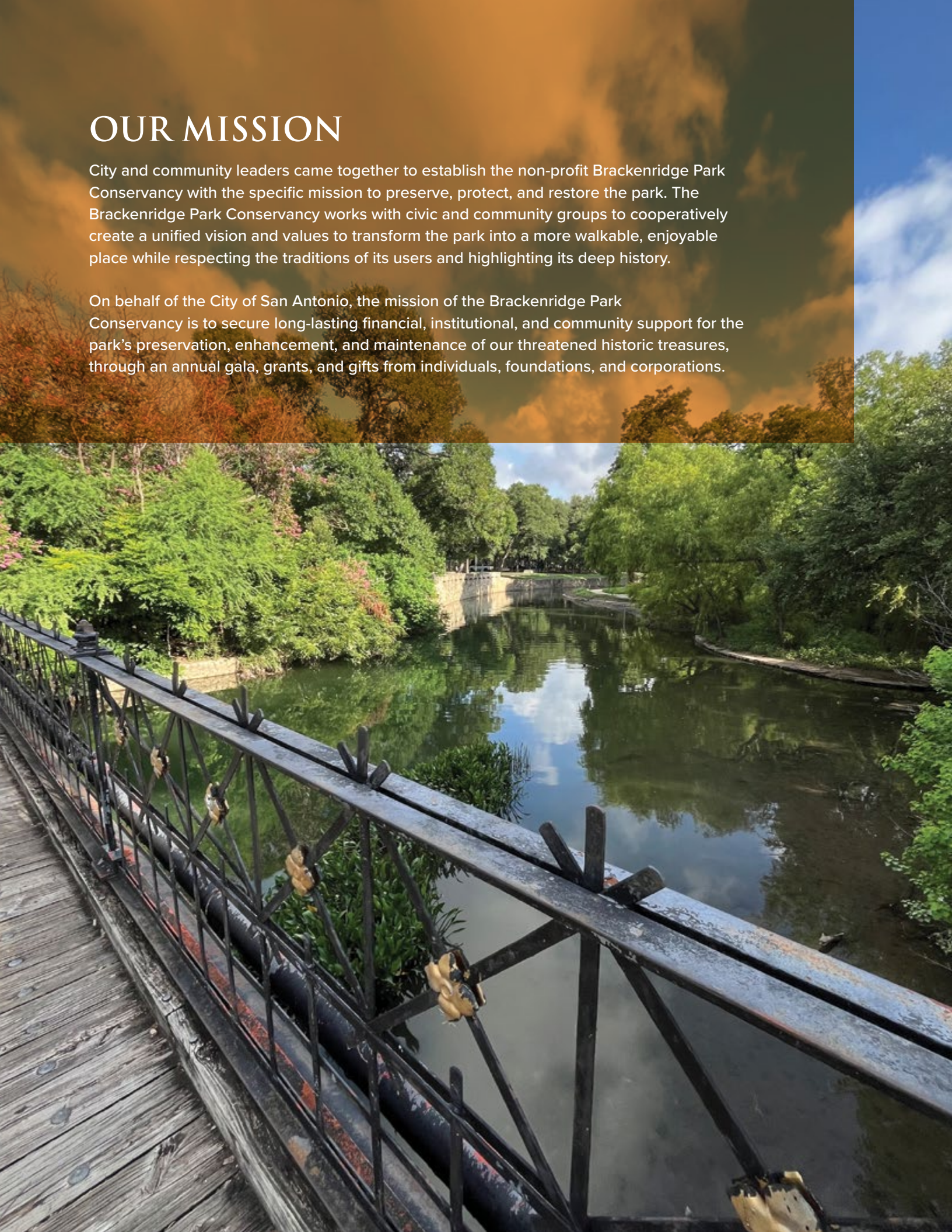

## FROM OUR CEO

Brackenridge is more than a park—it is one of our nation's most culturally significant places. How we steward this land matters. At The Conservancy, our mission is to preserve, protect, and restore the park, and that work is only possible because of your support. Thank you.

In 2024, we invited all of San Antonio to help shape guiding principles for park projects. With those principles now in place, we've been able to take meaningful steps forward in 2025. This progress is vital, as Brackenridge Park is in urgent need of maintenance, restoration, and a clear vision for the future.

Over the past year, we hosted more than 22 events, bringing an additional 19,000 people into the park. We also launched a robust volunteer program, holding more than 33 workdays to help clean and care for this treasured landscape. We debuted a new website to welcome people to the park, share our history, and promote events. Our marketing efforts saw astronomical growth with a near 50% increase in news stories noting the park, a 20-30% increase in social media followers, and a newsletter with an open rate that is more than double the industry average. These efforts are ensuring more people know about the park and have ways to engage with it.

Currently, we are in the midst of a fundraising campaign to build a much-needed Nature Playscape, a free, inclusive space designed to welcome people of all ages, income levels, and abilities. We need your help to push this past the finish line.

Our foundation as a conservancy has grown stronger, and our role in the community continues to expand. Much has been accomplished—and much more remains to be done.

# PARK PROJECTS

## NATURE PLAYSCAPE

Brackenridge Park Conservancy began work to build a much-needed interactive, nature-based playscape. Goals include using nature-based materials, incorporating thematic features, and providing universally accessible play areas to foster environmental stewardship and a sense of community.

A series of community meetings along with an online survey have helped to attain community input on areas of interest and initial designs. Next, the Conservancy continues fundraising to create final design schematics and begin building.

This is the first project approved by the Brackenridge Park Stakeholder Advisory Committee.

Brackenridge Park Conservancy is committed to providing vibrant, sustainable spaces that serve the diverse needs of San Antonio's families and communities.



# ANNUAL CONSERVANCY EVENTS

The Conservancy helped to host 22 park events and programs in 2025 which welcomed more than 19,000 attendees and volunteers. From major festivals and fundraisers to tours, markets, fitness classes, and clean-up efforts—these gatherings activated Brackenridge Park in meaningful ways: supporting preservation, encouraging wellness, celebrating culture, and bringing the community together year-round.

## PARTY IN THE PARK: MIRAFLORES

The Conservancy's signature fundraising event for 2025 was held in the historic Miraflores garden. 463 attendees enjoyed dining and entertainment under the stars while raising an impressive \$229,715 to further Brackenridge Park preservation and restoration efforts.



## POLO IN THE PARK

Polo's annual return to Brackenridge Park has become a big hit. This year, 500 guests enjoyed the much-anticipated polo match with live music, refreshments, and community building. It's become an annual social event where all of San Antonio can enjoy the park's polo history.



## 2ND ANNUAL WOMEN'S PICNIC IN THE PARK

This spring gathering transformed the park into a beautifully styled picnic with themed tables and conversation that united philanthropy with fellowship. A total of 110 women attended, raising more than \$30,000 in support of Miraflores.



## FAMILY FISHING DAY

Families lined the banks of the San Antonio River for a free day of fishing, learning, and outdoor fun. With Texas Parks and Wildlife catfish stocked in advance, loaner gear, and beginner-friendly instruction—the event drew more than 1,000 attendees eager to cast a line and enjoy the park.



## BRACK BASH

This free and annual party in the park for all of San Antonio brought more than 700 people together at the Sunken Garden Theater for live music, food vendors, kids' activities, and plenty of park pride.



## TOURS

### PRESERVATION MONTH HISTORIC WALKING TOUR

Our own Lynn Osborne Bobbitt guided this tour, sharing the park's layered history, architecture, and cultural landmarks through storytelling and on-site exploration.

### HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH: MIRAFLORES TOUR

More than 60 attendees joined the Conservancy to learn more about the cultural significance and history of Miraflores, highlighting its artistic features and ties to Hispanic heritage.

### PROFESSIONAL TOUR GUIDES ASSOCIATION HISTORIC MONTHLY TOURS

Two tours were held to provide insight into the park's history and evolution. The event centered on thoughtful exploration and discussion.

## PARTNERED EVENTS

### BASURA BASH

This environmental stewardship event welcomed 40 volunteers to remove more than 1,500 pounds of trash from the park and river areas. They made a visible and meaningful impact on the landscape.

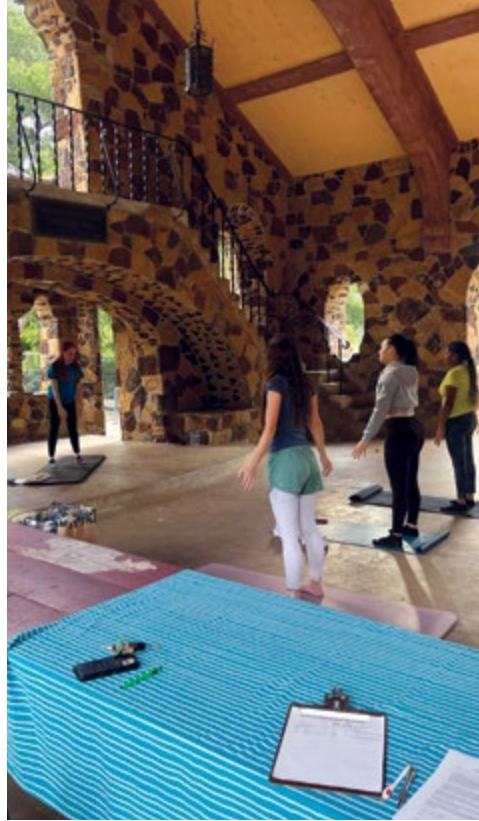
### PECHAKUCHA

This dynamic storytelling event produced by our own board of director's member, Vicki Yuan, featured fast-paced presentations from local speakers sharing ideas, art, and innovation. The evening attracted 400 attendees for an inspiring community gathering in the park.

### YELP! FIESTA MEDAL SCAVENGER HUNT

Participants explored the park during an interactive hunt for Fiesta medals, blending outdoor adventure with local tradition. The event drew 100 attendees.





## MONARCH BUTTERFLY & POLLINATOR FESTIVAL

In partnership with Blooming with Birdie, this large-scale festival celebrated pollinators through educational booths, butterfly activities, vendors, and hands-on experiences. An impressive 7,000 attendees participated in the nature-focused fun.

## TRICK OR TREAT ON THE TRAIL

This safe and care-free Halloween experience was hosted in partnership with Ghisallo Cycling Initiative. One thousand costumed attendees enjoyed decorated stations along park trails.

## SMALL BUSINESS SATURDAY MARKET AT JOSKE PAVILION

This holiday market showcased 10 local vendors, offering handmade goods and unique gifts while encouraging visitors to shop local and support entrepreneurs.

## WINTER IN THE PARK HOLIDAY MARKET & ART WALK

In partnership with Grace Hamilton Pottery, 12 vendors joined this festive event to combine holiday shopping with local art, creating a cheerful seasonal atmosphere.

## ONGOING PROGRAMS

### SAN ANTONIO SPORTS ACTIVATES: FITNESS IN THE PARK

This wellness series encouraged consistent community participation, with 38 yoga classes averaging 10 participants; and 34 bootcamp classes averaging 5 participants. The series is devoted to helping residents stay active in a scenic outdoor setting.

### PILATES IN THE PARK WITH OLIVIA WEBB

With 15 Saturday classes averaging five participants each, this series offered a welcoming, low-impact workout that blended movement, mindfulness, and fresh air.

### PARKOUR ADVENTURE CAMP

In partnership with Parkour Generations San Antonio, this summer camp gave youth the opportunity to build strength, coordination, and confidence through guided parkour training in the park's natural environment.

# VOLUNTEER EFFORTS

Brackenridge Park Conservancy's volunteer program had a strong first year! We took care of the park in a variety of ways including litter cleanups on trails, in the river, and around the park borders, painting park benches, cleaning the sculptures in Miraflores, and assisting with large events like the SA Marathon and the Monarch Festival. We look forward to having an even bigger 2026!

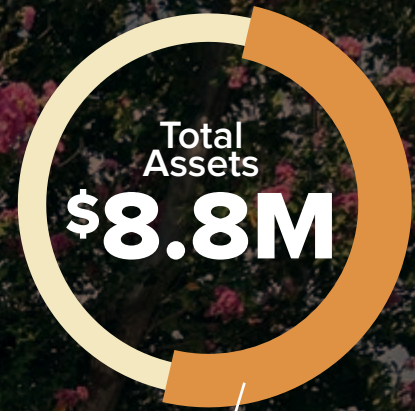

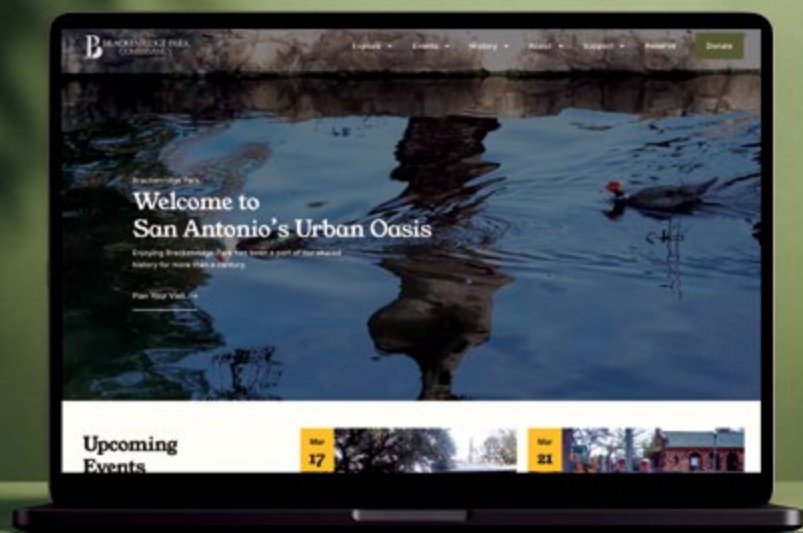

The launch of the newly redesigned BrackenridgePark.org in July 2025 marked a significant step forward in enhancing digital engagement and storytelling for the Conservancy. Following a promotional rollout in late July, highlighting the Arts Tour as a key feature, the site quickly gained traction, with the Arts page becoming the fourth most-visited section.

The new website also generated strong media interest, securing coverage in outlets such as CultureMap (syndicated via MSN), Glasstire, the San Antonio Express-News, News 4 San Antonio Living, and the Visit San Antonio blog. Together, these efforts have strengthened the Conservancy's digital presence and broadened public awareness of the park's cultural and recreational offerings.



## SUPPORT

The continued care and growth of Brackenridge Park are made possible through donations, partnerships and volunteer efforts. The in-park office continues to serve as a centrally located park satellite office for tours and volunteer gatherings.
